# CROWN LANDS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS).

No. 79 of 1952.

AN ACT to provide for the reinstatement of certain persons as purchasers of Crown land, to authorise the Governor to convey and alienate certain pieces of land, to provide for the alteration of certain notifications relating to the acquisition of land by the Crown, and to amend the Crown Lands (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act (No. 2) 1951.

[12 December, 1952.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1-(1) This Act may be cited as the Crown Lands (Miscel-Short title and incorporalaneous Provisions) Act 1952.

- (2) This Act is incorporated and shall be read as one with the Crown Lands Act 1935.
- 2—(1) The Commissioner may, with the consent of the Power to reinstate as Governor, reinstate the persons named in the first schedule purchasers as purchasers of the several areas of land set opposite to sons named in their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts the first schedule, regulating the sale and disposition of Crown lands under whose lands which the purchases of those areas were made respectively. forfeited.

- (2) A person who is reinstated as the purchaser of any land in pursuance of subsection (1) of this section shall be liable to pay all instalments due in respect of the land at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due in respect thereof, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by section seventy-two of the Principal Act, and interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the dates when those instalments become due respectively.
