on the resignation, retirement, or death of any such officers, and the creation and establishment of funds for those purposes, or the continuation of any funds for those purposes established before the commencement of this Act;"; and

- (b) by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:—
 - "(2) For the purposes of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of this section—
 - (a) the secretary and the officers and employees of the Commission shall be deemed to be officers of the Commission: and
 - (b) the secretary and employees of a board and the officers and members of the brigades maintained by a board shall be deemed to be officers of that board.".

CROWN LANDS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS).

No. 46 of 1965.

AN ACT to provide for the vesting of certain lands in the Crown and for the disposal of those lands, and certain other lands of the Crown, and to provide for incidental and consequential matters.

[3 December 1965.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Crown Lands (Mis-short title and incorporation.
- (2) This Act is incorporated, and shall be read as one, with the *Crown Lands Act* 1935 (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act).

Revesting of part of a Launceston Corporation.

- **2**—(1) All public rights of passage over the lands described in the first schedule are extinguished and those lands revert to and revest in Her Majesty absolutely, freed and discharged from all estates and interests therein subsisting in any person.
- (2) The Commissioner may sell the lands referred to in subsection (1) of this section to The Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Launceston for the sum of twenty-five pounds.
- (3) A grant fee of three pounds is required to be paid before a grant is made of the land referred to in this section.

Revesting of former **3** The land described in the second schedule reverts to and zeehan School revests in Her Majesty absolutely, freed and discharged from of Mines. all estates and interests therein subsisting in any person.

Sale of Crown land at Whitemark to R.S.S.A.I.L.A.

- 4—(1) The Commissioner may sell the Crown land described in the third schedule to the Returned Sailors', Soldiers' and Airmen's Imperial League of Australia for the sum of one thousand one hundred and seventy-five pounds.
- (2) Survey and grant fees, amounting in all to fifteen pounds ten shillings, are required to be paid before a grant is made of the land referred to in this section.

Sale of G. Kramer.

5 The Commissioner may, on such terms and conditions reservation to as may be determined by the Surveyor-General, sell by private R. Van der Woude and Gerald Kramer both of Penguin in this State, the land described in the fourth schedule.

Sale of Crown land at Nubeena to Mrs. L. M. Westcott.

6 The Commissioner may, on such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Surveyor-General, sell by private contract to Leita May Westcott, of Nubeena in this State, the land described in the fifth schedule.

Grant of Crown land at Bellerive to Tasmanian Teachers' Federation and Girl Guides' Association.

- **7** On payment of the prescribed survey and grant fees the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant, convey and alienate in fee simple-
 - (a) the land described in Part I of the sixth schedule to the Tasmanian State School Teachers' Federation; and
 - (b) the land described in Part II of that schedule to the Girl Guides' Association (Tasmania).

to grants on sale of Crown to sell any Crown land, the Governor may, in the name and land under this Act. of the sum or other consideration required to be paid or furnished by this Act or the contract under which the land is sold, and upon the payment of any survey or grant fees so required to be paid before a grant of the land is made, by deed of grant, convey and alienate the land in fee simple to the person to whom it is by this Act authorized to be sold.
