

OFFICERS OF PARLIAMENT SALARIES.

No. 38 of 1951.

AN ACT to amend the *Officers of Parliament Salaries Act 1927.* [28 September, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Officers of Parliament Salaries Act 1951.* Short title and citation.

(2) The *Officers of Parliament Salaries Act 1927**, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section three of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (1) thereof the following subsection:— Salaries payable to officers mentioned in the schedule.

“(1A) There shall be paid to the Deputy Chairman of Committees of the Legislative Council, while acting as Chairman of Committees of the Council during any period during which the Chairman of Committees acts as Deputy-President of the Council, a salary calculated at the rate of one hundred and seventy-five pounds per annum.”

3 The Principal Act is amended by omitting from the schedule thereto the numerals “175” and substituting therefor the numerals “250”. Schedule.

INSPECTION OF MACHINERY (No. 2).

No. 39 of 1951.

AN ACT to amend the *Inspection of Machinery Act 1902.* [28 September, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Inspection of Machinery Act (No. 2) 1951.* Short title and citation.

(2) The *Inspection of Machinery Act 1902**, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Power of Governor to exempt machinery &c., from this Act.

2 After section seven of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

“7A The Governor, on the recommendation of the Chief Inspector, may, by proclamation, exempt any kind, class description, or type of machinery, boiler, pressure vessel from the provisions of this Act, or from such of those provisions as may be specified in the proclamation, either unconditionally or upon and subject to such conditions as may be specified therein.”

Regulations.

3 Section fifty-eight of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (5) thereof the word “elevators” and substituting therefor the word “escalators”.

TUBERCULOSIS.

No. 40 of 1951.

AN ACT to amend the *Tuberculosis Act 1949*.
[28 September, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Tuberculosis Act 1951*.

(2) The *Tuberculosis Act 1949**, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Notice requiring specified persons of certain classes to submit to examination.

2 Section five of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (2) thereof the words “not less than three newspapers” and substituting therefor the words “at least one newspaper”.

Notice requiring individuals to undergo certain examinations.

3 Section six of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) the word “delivered” and substituting therefor the word “given”.
