

## KINGBOROUGH WATER.

### AN ACT to amend the *Kingborough Water Act 1941*. [9 December, 1953.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Kingborough Water Act 1953*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Kingborough Water Act 1941*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) the words “for the purposes of this Act”. Power to impose a service charge.

**3** Section eight of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) the words “for the purposes of this Act”. Power to impose annual charge in respect of building blocks.

**4** After section ten of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

“10A The powers conferred on the Council by sections seven to ten are exercisable by the Council in respect of land within a water district, whether water is supplied to that district by the Council pursuant to a contract under section three or otherwise.” Extent of Council's powers under certain sections.

**5** Notwithstanding anything contained in section one hundred and ninety-four of the *Local Government Act 1906*, the Council may, during the construction and installation of any waterworks authorized by the Principal Act, after passing a special resolution for that purpose as required by that section, with the approval of the Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Board, from time to time obtain advances from any bank by overdraft on the current account of the Council upon the credit of the municipality to finance the progress payments of the construction and installation of those waterworks. Power of Council to borrow moneys on overdraft.

**6** Upon completion of the waterworks referred to in section five of this Act the money raised by overdraft as provided by that section shall be repaid by the sale of debentures under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1906* and the *Local Bodies Loans Act 1881*. Repayment of moneys borrowed on overdraft.
