KINGBOROUGH WATER.

No. 84 of 1953.

AN ACT to amend the Kingborough Water Act 1941. [9 December, 1953.]

RE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:---

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Kingborough Water short title $Ac\bar{t}$ 1953.
- (2) The Kingborough Water Act 1941, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- 2 Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by omit-Power to ting from subsection (1) the words "for the purposes of this impose a service charge. Act ".
- 3 Section eight of the Principal Act is amended by omit-power to ting from subsection (1) the words "for the purposes of this annual charge Act ".

in respect of building

- 4 After section ten of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:-
- "10A The powers conferred on the Council by sections Extent of seven to ten are exercisable by the Council in respect of land Council's within a water district, whether water is supplied to that certain district by the Council pursuant to a contract under section sections. three or otherwise.".

5 Notwithstanding anything contained in section one power of hundred and ninety-four of the Local Government Act 1906, Council to hundred and ninety-four of the Local Government Act 1906, Council to the Council may, during the construction and installation moneys of any waterworks authorized by the Principal Act, after overdraft. passing a special resolution for that purpose as required by that section, with the approval of the Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Board, from time to time obtain advances from any bank by overdraft on the current account of the Council upon the credit of the municipality to finance the progress payments of the construction and installation of those waterworks.

6 Upon completion of the waterworks referred to in section Repayment of five of this Act the money raised by overdraft as provided borrowed on by that section shall be repaid by the sale of debentures under overdraft. the provisions of the Local Government Act 1906 and the Local $Bodies\ Loans\ Act\ 1881.$
