AN ACT to amend the *Hadspen Water Act* 1947. [14 October 1958.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Hadspen Water Act Short title, citation, and commencement.
- (2) The *Hadspen Water Act* 1947, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July 1958.
- 2 Section twenty-three of the Principal Act is amended by Water rate. omitting from paragraph (b) of subsection (1) the words "one pound" and substituting therefor the words "three pounds ten shillings".

# LOAN FUND APPROPRIATION (No. 3).

### No. 43 of 1958.

AN ACT to authorize the issue and application of moneys from the Loan Fund, and to provide for matters incidental thereto.

[14 October 1958.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Loan Fund Appropriation short title. Act (No. 3) 1958.

Interpretation.

- 2 In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—
  - "Financial Agreement" means the agreement made between the Commonwealth and the States and ratified by the *Financial Agreement Act* 1927, and includes that agreement as varied from time to time and any agreement made in substitution therefor:
  - therefor;
    "Loan Fund" means the Loan Fund established under section six of the Public Account Act 1957.

Appropriation of Loan Fund.

- **3**—(1) For the purposes of this Act, the Treasurer may issue out of the Loan Fund (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly) the sum of £5,346,371.
- (2) Of the sum issued out of the Loan Fund under the authority of this section—
  - (a) the sum of £2,074,035 may be applied for the several public works or purposes that are specified in the first schedule;
  - (b) the sum of £59,500 may be applied in accordance with the provisions of the *Metropolitan Transport Act* 1954 by way of capital expenditure in connection with the works and purposes that are specified in the second schedule;
  - (c) the sum of £392,836 may be applied in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act* 1938, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, for the works and purposes that are specified in the third schedule; and
  - (d) the sum of £2,820,000 may be applied in accordance with the provisions of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act* 1944 for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carrying out the works that are specified in the fourth schedule.

Power of Treasurer to borrow moneys. 4 For the purposes of this Act, the Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing on behalf of the State, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £5.346.371.

Authority for carrying out of works and purposes.

- 5—(1) The public works and purposes that are specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed and carried out.
- (2) The sum to be expended pursuant to this Act for any work or purpose that is specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the sum set forth in that schedule in respect of that work or purpose.
- (3) The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works that are specified in the fourth schedule is authorized.

6 On the commencement of this Act, the moneys that are Certain specified in the fourth column of the fifth schedule (being the to lapse. unexpended balance of the moneys authorized by the enactments that are specified in the first column of that schedule to be applied for the public works and purposes respectively set forth opposite those sums in the third column of that schedule) cease to be available for those purposes, and the authority for the expenditure of those sums of money lapses accordingly.

# APPROPRIATION.

#### No. 44 of 1958.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1959, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year. [31 October 1958.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—
