**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Marine Act* 1943.

**2** The Principal Act is hereby amended—

**I.** As to section forty-four thereof—

(a) By expunging paragraphs IV. to VI. and substituting therefor the following new paragraphs IV. and V.—

“IV. Holds any office or place of profit, other than the office of Master Warden or Chairman or Treasurer, under or in the gift of the board or trust or, except as hereinafter provided, directly or indirectly by himself or any other person, has any interest in any contract with or employment under the board or trust: or

V. Ceases to possess the qualification required for election as a warden or trustee, as the case may be.”: and

(b) By inserting after subsection (1) the following new subsection (1A)—

“(1A) No person shall be disqualified from continuing to hold the office of a warden or trustee by reason only of the fact that he has any interest in any contract made or entered into—

I. By the board or trust with any incorporated company of not less than twenty members of whom such person is one:

II. For any lease or agreement for a lease by the board or trust to such person of any land, wharf, shed, store, or office: or

III. In respect of any work done, or services rendered, by the board or trust under the provisions of any Act.”: and

II. By expunging subsection (8) of section one hundred and thirty-nine thereof and substituting therefor the following new subsection (8)—

“(8) No person shall carry, or permit to be carried, on any launch plying for hire any greater number of persons than the number specified in that behalf in the licence issued in respect of such launch.

Penalty: Twenty pounds, with an additional five shillings in respect of each person in excess of the number permitted to be carried.”.
