AN ACT to amend the Opticians Act 1913. [28 September, 1951.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Opticians Act 1951. Short title and citation.
(2) The Opticians Act 1913*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section twenty-seven of the Principal Act is amended Registration by omitting from subsection (3) thereof the words "one fees, &c. pound" and substituting therefor the words "such amount, being not less than one pound or more than ten pounds, as may be prescribed,".

MOLE CREEK WATER.

AN ACT to amend the Mole Creek Water Act 1946. [28 September, 1951.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1-(1) This Act may be cited as the *Mole Creek Water* short title and citation.

(2) The Mole Creek Water Act 1946*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Borrowing powers. 2 Section twenty-nine of the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the word "seven" and substituting therefor the word "seventeen".

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 2).

No. 45 of 1951.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes. [28 September, 1951.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania. by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £48,200. 1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Act (No. 2) 1951.

2-(1) The public works and purposes specified in the schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under, or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of that work or purpose.

3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £48,200, and may apply the same for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the schedule.
