1. Short title.
2. Amendment of 22 Vict. No. 23, s. 50.

AN ACT to amend the *Mental Hospitals Act* 1858. A.D. 1942
[22 July, 1942.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Mental Hospitals Act* 1942. Short title.

2 The Principal Act is hereby amended by inserting at the end of section fifty thereof (inserted by the *Mental Hospitals Act* 1939) the following new subsection (3)— Amendment of 22 Vict. No. 23, s. 50.

“(3) The regulations may provide that all charges payable for or in respect of the lodging, maintenance, medicine, clothing, and care of any person in the hospital shall be in accordance with prescribed rates or scales, and may authorise the Minister to remit the payment of the whole or any part of such charges in respect of any person in any special case in which, in his opinion, the collection thereof would be harsh or inequitable.”
