

MINERS' PENSIONS.

No. 43 of 1952.

AN ACT to amend the *Miners' Pensions Act 1944*.
[17 October, 1952.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Miners' Pensions Act 1952*. Short title, citation, and commencement.

(2) The *Miners' Pensions Act 1944*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of December, 1951.

2 Section twenty of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) thereof the words “three pounds seven shillings and sixpence” and substituting therefor the words “three pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence”. Qualification for pension.

3 Section twenty-one of the Principal Act is amended— Additional payments to pensioners in certain cases.

(a) by omitting from paragraph I. of subsection (1) the words “two pounds twelve shillings and sixpence” and substituting therefor the words “three pounds two shillings and sixpence”; and

(b) by omitting from paragraph III. of that subsection the words “two pounds two shillings and sixpence” and substituting therefor the words “three pounds two shillings and sixpence”.

4 Section twenty-two of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from paragraphs I. and II. of subsection (2) the words “two pounds twelve shillings and sixpence” (wherever occurring) and substituting therefor, in each case, the words “three pounds two shillings and sixpence”. Pensioners to dependants.

5 Section twenty-six of the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the words “seven pounds seven shillings” and substituting therefor the words “eight pounds seven shillings”. Limitation of amount of pension.
