AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes, and for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1929 and the Transport Act 1938. [14 December, 1944.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Public Works Execution (No. 2).

PART L

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

2-(1) The public works and purposes specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £326,111 and apply the same for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART II.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £230,000 for transport works.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £230,000 and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the Transport Act 1938, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.

PART III.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

Power to Treasurer to horrow £500,000 for purposes of hydro-electric works. 20 Geo. V.

No. 83. Authority for construction

of works.

5 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £500,000 and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1929, for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carrying out the works specified in the third schedule.

6 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works referred to in the third schedule is hereby authorised.
