

(b) by inserting after subsection (5) the following subsection:—

“(5A) Where the Board is satisfied, on the report of the State Librarian, that it is necessary or desirable so to do in order to ensure the proper equipment or development of any library, provided, controlled, and managed by a council under and in accordance with this Act (not being a library to which subsection (5) of this section applies) the Board may, in its discretion, determine that, for such period as the Board may fix, any State aid that may be granted to that council under this section shall consist of a cash subsidy of such amount as the Board may determine, either in addition to, or in substitution for, the loan of a collection of books, as provided by subsection (4) of this section.”.

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 2).

No. 60 of 1952.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money, and the re-appropriation of certain unexpended moneys, for meeting the cost of those works and purposes, and for the purposes of the *Transport Act 1938*, and *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944*.

[2 December, 1952.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act (No. 2) 1952*. Short title.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

2—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £289,686 and re-appropriate £10,000.

3 The Treasurer may—

(a) borrow any sums of money not exceeding £289,686; and

(b) re-appropriate the sum of £10,000 specified in the fourth schedule,

and may apply the sums so borrowed and re-appropriated for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART II.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £404,500 for transport works.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £404,500, and apply the sums so borrowed in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act 1938* by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.

PART III.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £10,850,000 for purposes of hydro-electric works.

5 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £10,850,000 and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944* for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carrying out the works specified in the third schedule.

Authority for construction of works.

6 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works referred to in Part I. of the third schedule is hereby authorised.

Special provisions relating to certain moneys to be borrowed for hydro-electric works.

7 Upon the amount referred to in Part II. of the third schedule to this Act, or any part of that amount, being made available to the Hydro-Electric Commission, the provisions of section two of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1948* shall apply to and in respect of that amount, or, as the case may be,

that part thereof, in the same manner and to the same extent in all respects as if that amount, or that part thereof, were moneys advanced to the Commission by the Treasurer under or for the purposes of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of that section.
