AN ACT to provide for the Execution of certain 1936. Works in connection with the State Railways. [1 December, 1936.]

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 This Act may be cited as the Railway Works Execu- Short title. tion Act 1936.

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Power to Minister to undertake works. 2 The Minister may cause the works specified in the first and second schedules to be undertaken and executed at a cost not exceeding in each case the amount specified in those schedules in respect thereof.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £77,376 7s. 5d. and to reappropriate £4958 12s. 7d.

- 3 The Treasurer may—
 - 1. Raise, borrow, and receive any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of seventy-seven thousand three hundred and seventy-six pounds seven shillings and five pence: and
 - n. Reappropriate the sums specified in the third schedule, being the unexpended balances of the amounts appropriated for the items set forth in that schedule, and apply the aggregate thereof, amounting to four thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight pounds twelve shillings and seven pence—

for the purpose of defraying the cost of the works authorised by this Act.

Sinking fund in respect of c rtain item. 4 There shall be paid out of the Tasmanian Government Railways Replacement and Depreciation Fund, to the National Debt Sinking Fund established under the laws of the Commonwealth, in each of the five years commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, the sum of eleven thousand pounds for the purpose of providing a sinking fund in respect of the purchase of the rolling-stock specified in item 26 in the second schedule.
