

LOCAL BODIES LOANS.

No. 2 of 1961.

AN ACT to amend the *Local Bodies Loans Act* 1881. [13 July 1961.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title
and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Local Bodies Loans Act* 1961.

(2) The *Local Bodies Loans Act* 1881, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section thirteen of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting at the end of paragraph II of subsection (2) the word “and”; and

(b) by adding at the end of that subsection the words
“ : and

“ IV Other works and the acquisition of property may be made payable on any day approved by the Minister.”.

SUPPLY 1961-1962.

No. 3 of 1961.

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1962. [14 July 1961.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Supply Act* 1961-1962.

2 There may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1962 the sum of £5,187,400 out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule, and the Treasurer is authorized to issue and apply the moneys so authorized to be issued and applied.

Issue and application of £5,187,400.

3 The sum specified in section two is made available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the schedule.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in schedule.

4 The Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any warrant mentioned in section three, and the receipts of the respective persons to whom any sums of money are so paid are a full and valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for them accordingly.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in accounts.
