

- (ii) If the amount of the annuity, immediately prior to the commencement of this Act, exceeded one hundred and thirty pounds per annum, the rate thereof shall be increased by an amount equivalent to twenty per cent of one hundred and thirty pounds per annum; and
- (b) In the case of an annuity payable to the widow of a subscriber—
- (i) If the amount of the annuity, immediately prior to the commencement of this Act, did not exceed sixty-five pounds per annum, the rate thereof shall be increased by twenty per cent; or
  - (ii) If the amount of the annuity, immediately prior to the commencement of this Act, exceeded sixty-five pounds per annum, the rate thereof shall be increased by an amount equivalent to twenty per cent of sixty-five pounds per annum.

(2) Every annuity which is in force and payable, or for which any person is eligible, at the commencement of this Act shall, from and after such commencement, be paid at a rate increased in accordance with such of the provisions of subsection (1) of this section as may be appropriate.

(3) The Treasurer shall pay to the Fund out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is hereby appropriated accordingly), all such amounts as may be necessary to give effect to the increases in the rates of annuities prescribed by this section.

No. 57 of 1951.

AN ACT supplementary to the Acts for appropriating certain Sums arising from the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ended the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one. [18 October, 1951.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Supplementary Appropriation Act 1950-51.*

**2** The sum of five hundred and eighty four thousand, four hundred and thirteen pounds seventeen shillings and elevenpence, which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Tasmania for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June; one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one for the several purposes specified in the schedule shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the *Appropriation Act 1950-51* for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule.

## APPROPRIATION, 1951-52.

### No. 58 of 1951.

AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for that Year in this Session of Parliament. [1 November, 1951.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1951-52*.

Issue and application of £4,891,974.

**2** The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, the sum of four million eight hundred and ninety-one thousand nine hundred and seventy-four pounds.

Appropriation of supplies.

**3** All sums granted by this Act and the *Supply Act 1951-52*, out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the first schedule, in the aggregate to the sum of six million, five hundred and sixty thousand eight hundred and seventy-four pounds, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of those Acts for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule to this Act.
