AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for such Year in this Session of the Parliament. [21 *December*, 1918.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1918-19." Short title.
- 2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and Issue and appliapply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His cation of Majesty for the service of the year ending the Thirtieth day of £444,797 5s. 5d. June, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the sum of Four hundred and forty-four thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven Pounds Five Shillings and Five Pence.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 All sums granted by this Act and "The Supply Act (No. 1), 1918-19," and "The Supply Act (No. 2), 1918-19," out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the First Schedule to this Act, in the aggregate to the sum of Eight hundred and fifty-five thousand one hundred and eighty-two Pounds Five Shillings and Five Pence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of "The Supply Act (No. 1), 1918-19," for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule.

Moneys payable by warrant of the Governor.

4 The Treasurer shall issue and pay the several sums to such persons for the purposes in the said Second Schedule mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant under his hand, from time to time orders and directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in accounts.

5 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Governor may make Regulations where War Bonus is to be distributed as prescribed.

6—(1) In any case where a sum of money is appropriated by this Act for the purpose of a War Bonus to be distributed as prescribed, the Governor may make Regulations prescribing and regulating the distribution of any such sum, and the mode of distribution: Provided that no portion of a War Bonus shall be paid to any member of the State Service, who on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand Nine hundred and Eighteen, was in receipt of, or entitled to a salary at a rate exceeding Three hundred and Fifty Pounds a year.

(2) All Regulations made by the Governor under this Section shall be published in the Gazette, and thereupon shall have the force of law, and the provisions of Section Forty-four of "The Interpretation Act,

1906," shall not apply in respect of such Regulations.
