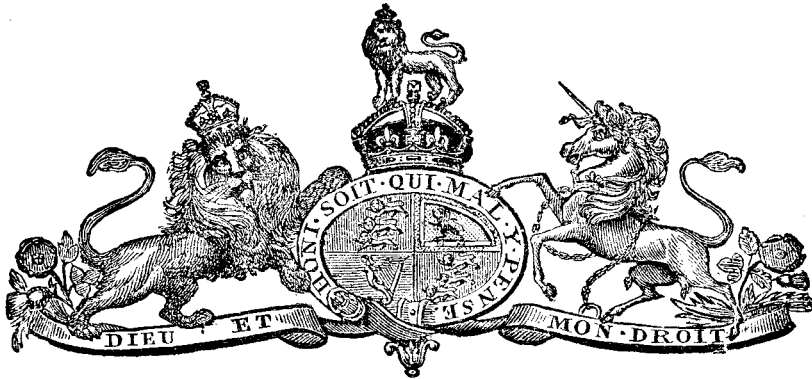

AN ACT for appropriating a certain Sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Appropriation Act (No. 2), Short title. 1928-29.”

Appropriation (No. 2), 1928-29.

Appropriation of £3099 2s. 3d.
- 2** Out of the Consolidated Revenue there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, for the several purposes specified in the schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of Three thousand and ninety-nine Pounds Two Shillings and Three Pence, but so that the amount to be appropriated, issued, and applied for each such purpose as aforesaid shall not exceed the sum set out in the said schedule in respect thereof.
- Moneys payable by warrant of Governor.**
- 3** The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several sums so set out as aforesaid to such persons for the purposes in the said schedule mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant under his hand, from time to time orders and directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue.
- Credit to be given to the Treasurer in accounts.**
- 4** The Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
