

AN ACT to further amend *The Auction Act.* A.D. 1903.
[23 December, 1903.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Auction Amendment Act, 1903.” Short title.

2—(1.) Any Two Justices of the Peace, in Petty Sessions assembled, on payment of the fee hereinafter mentioned to the Clerk of Petty Sessions, may, on the written application of any holder of an Auctioneer’s Licence, if satisfied that his inability to act as auctioneer arises from illness, grant to such holder a temporary licence to sell by auction by his clerk or deputy in any place in which such holder is by his licence authorised to act as an auctioneer. Temporary licence to clerk or deputy of licensed auctioneer.

(2.) Such temporary licence shall be in the form in the Schedule to this Act or to the like effect, and such clerk or deputy shall thereupon, at the place and on the day specified in such temporary licence, be authorised to act as an auctioneer on behalf of the holder aforesaid.

(3.) A fee of One Pound shall be payable for each day for which the licence is granted, and all such fees shall be paid into and form part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

(4.) The holder of an Auctioneer's Licence shall not in any year be granted more than Six temporary licences. Such holder shall be personally liable and responsible for all acts and defaults of any clerk or deputy acting on his behalf by virtue of any such licence, in the same manner and to the same extent as such auctioneer would have been liable if such act had been done or such default made by such auctioneer.

(5.) During the day such temporary licence is in force the licence granted to the holder of such Auctioneer's Licence shall be suspended.
