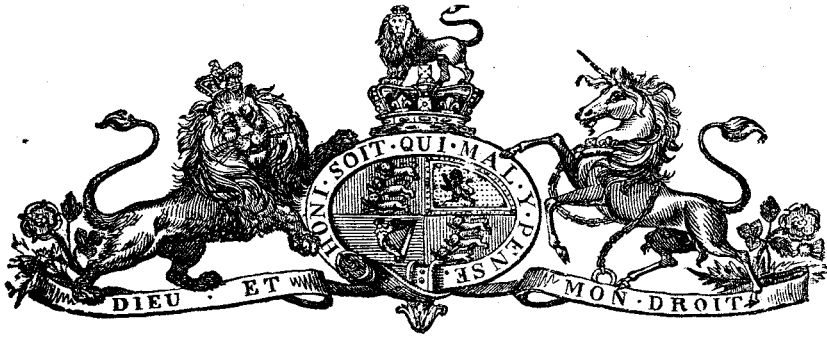

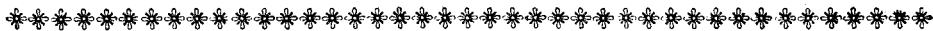

AN ACT for the Abolition of Pensions.  
[30 July, 1863.]

**W**HEREAS it hath been found that the system of giving PREAMBLE.  
Superannuation and other Allowances to persons having held Civil  
Offices in the Service of the Colonial Government is burdensome to  
the Finances of the Colony, without being advantageous to the Public  
Service: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of  
*Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative  
Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** No person who shall enter into the Civil Service of this Colony after the commencement of this Act shall be entitled to or receive any Pension, Superannuation, or other Allowance or Gratuity upon his dismissal from, or resignation of, any office which he may hold in the Civil Service of this Colony, or upon the abolition of such office, or upon the consolidation of such office with any other office or offices. No person entering the Civil Service after commencement of Act entitled to Pension, &c.

**2** *The Superannuation Act*, and so much of all other Acts as authorise the granting of Pensions, Superannuation, or other Allowances to persons having held offices in the Civil Service of this Colony, shall, from and after the commencement of this Act, apply only to persons who, at the commencement of this Act, are serving in an established capacity in the permanent Civil Service of this Colony. 24 Vict. No. 15 not to apply to persons entering Civil Service after commencement of this Act.

**3** This Act shall commence and take effect on the First day of *August* in the year 1863. Commencement of Act.

**4** In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression *The Abolition of Pensions Act*. Short Title.
