

AN ACT to further amend The Cemeteries A.D. 1900. [6 December, 1900.] Act, 1865.

WHEREAS it is expedient to further amend The Cemeteries Act, PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Cemeteries Short title. Amendment Act, 1900.'
- 2 Sections Thirty, Thirty-one, Thirty-four, and Thirty-five of The Repeal. Cemeteries Act, 1865, and Section Four of "The Cemeteries Amendation No. 7. 34 Vict. No. 29. ment Act, 1870," are hereby repealed.
- 3 The Trustees of every Cemetery shall, by their Chairman, before Accounts to be the last day of February in every year, forward to the Auditor-General forwarded to the abstract of accounts mentioned in Section Twenty-nine of The Auditor-General. Cemeteries Act, 1865, accompanied with proper vouchers in support of the same, and all such books, papers, and writings in the custody or power of the Trustees relating thereto as the said Auditor-General requires to be furnished to him; and the Auditor-General shall make and deliver to the said Chairman a special report upon such accounts, or, if the said accounts are found correct, the Auditor-General shall simply confirm and sign the same in token of his allowance thereof; and such

abstract of accounts shall be published in the Hobart Gazette by the Auditor-General as soon as may be after such accounts have been audited.

Accounts to be No. 43.

4 The accounts of the Trustees of every Cemetery shall be subject subject to 52 Vict. and liable to all the provisions of "The Audit Act, 1888," in the same manner in all respects as if such accounts had been specifically mentioned therein.

Officers to be amenable to provisions of 52 Vict. No. 43.

5 Every officer appointed or employed by the Trustees of every Cemetery in the receipt or disbursement of moneys or other property shall be amenable to all the provisions of "The Audit Act, 1888," in the same manner in all respects as if such officer had been an officer in the Public Service.

Payment of money to Trustees by Governor.

6 It shall be lawful for the Governor to order the payment to the Trustees of any Cemetery of all such moneys as, in the opinion of the Governor, may be necessary for the formation, establishment, or improvement of such cemetery, and the total of such sums of money shall not exceed the sum of Three Thousand Pounds, and shall be paid out of moneys to be provided by Parliament, and shall be applied and disposed of only in such manner as the Governor approves; and all moneys which have been advanced to the Trustees of the Public Cemeteries at Zeehan, Fingal, and St. Mary's, shall be deemed to have been paid under the provisions of this Act.

Appropriation of moneys received by Trustees on account of fees and penalties.

7 Out of the moneys received by the Trustees of every Cemetery on account of fees and penalties, there shall be paid into the Treasury at such periods as the Governor may direct, so much as may be necessary to pay interest at the rate of Four Pounds per centum per annum on the moneys paid to such Trustees under the last preceding Section, and also such further sum or sums as the Governor may direct for the purpose of repaying the amount that may be so advanced as aforesaid.

Acts to be read together.

8 This Act and The Cemeteries Act, 1865, and every Act amending the same shall, save as altered or amended by this Act, be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
