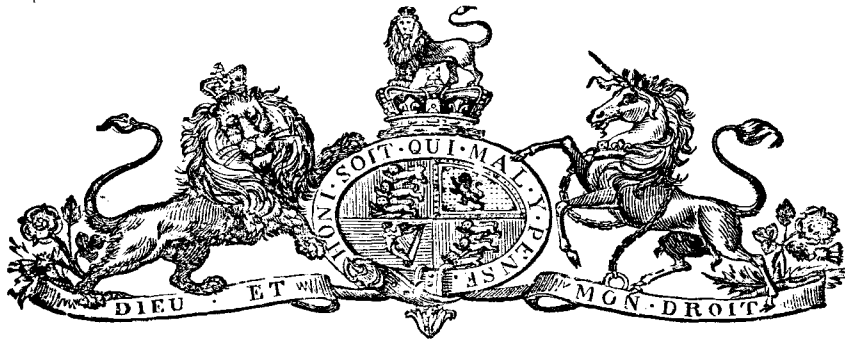

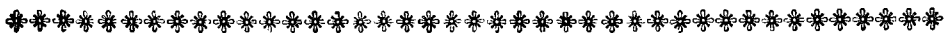

AN ACT to amend "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1879." A.D. 1879.
[3 November, 1879.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1879," in certain particulars: PREAMBLE.
42 Vict. No. 36.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In the construction of this Act "the said Act" means "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1879." Interpretation.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, to appoint any Building, together with any yards or enclosures attached thereto, or any part of any Building as and to be a Hospital in which persons may be placed for medical treatment under the said Act. Proclamation of Hospitals.

3 Section Five of the said Act is hereby repealed, save as to all things duly done thereunder before the commencement of this Act. Repeal.

4 This Act and the said Act shall, as amended by this Act, be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

5 This Act and the said Act may be cited together as "The Contagious Diseases Acts, 1879." Citation of Act.
