

AN ACT to amend "An Act to prevent the A.D. 1880. introduction into Tasmania of Infectious or Contagious Diseases amongst Cattle."

[20 October, 1880.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The Act of the Parliament of Tasmania of the 25th Victoria, Short title. No. 4, may be cited as "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1861;" and this Act may be cited as "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, Acts to be read 1880;" and the said Act, as amended by this Act, and this Act shall be together. read and construed together as one Act.

2 The Chief Inspector of Sheep under "The Scab Act, 1875," Chief Inspector shall be the Chief Inspector of Stock under this Act; and it shall be of Stock. lawful for the Chief Inspector of Stock, by any writing under his hand, to delegate to any Inspector of Sheep under the said Act the performance of any act or thing which, by this Act, he is empowered to perform; and all things lawfully done by any Inspector of Sheep under this Act shall be deemed to have been done by the Chief Inspector of Stock; and the production of any such writing purporting to be signed by the and the production of any such writing purporting to be signed by the Chief Inspector shall in all legal proceedings without other proof be conclusive evidence of the delegation of such Inspector.

Contagious Diseases (Cattle).

Establishment of Quarantine Grounds.

3 It shall be lawful for the Chief Inspector of Stock from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to rent or purchase such land as may be necessary for the purpose of establishing thereon Quarantine Grounds, and to erect thereon such fences, enclosures, sheds, and other buildings and erections as may be required for the purposes of this Act; and notice shall be given by the Chief Inspector in the Gazette of the situation and boundaries of all such Quarantine Grounds; and the production of the Gazette containing any such notice shall in all legal proceedings be conclusive evidence that any such Quarantine Ground has been duly established under this Act.

Defrayment of expenses in establishing Quarantine Grounds. 4 All expenses incurred in establishing Quarantine Grounds under this Act shall be defrayed by the Colonial Treasurer out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Notice of intended importation to be given.

5 Every person intending to import into this Colony or any Dependency thereof any Cattle other than for slaughter, from any place beyond this Colony or any Dependency thereof, shall give to the Chief Inspector of Stock not less than Fourteen days' notice in writing of his intention so to do; and every such notice shall contain a statement of the number and description of the Cattle intended to be imported, the port at which the same are intended to be landed, and the time when such Cattle are expected to arrive at such port; and every person who imports any such Cattle and neglects to give notice thereof in accordance with this provision shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty of not less than Fifty Pounds nor more than Five hundred Pounds; and all Cattle imported contrary to this provision shall, upon the conviction of the offender, become forfeited to Her Majesty, and may be disposed of in such manner as the Governor in Council sees fit.

For the purposes of this Section King's Island shall be deemed to be a place beyond this Colony: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by notice published in the Gazette, to declare that King's Island shall not after the date of such notice, and for any period therein named, be deemed to be a place beyond this Colony.

Cattle to be landed at place appointed and removed to Quarantine Ground.

6 All Cattle imported into this Colony other than for slaughter shall, on arrival, be landed at such place or places as the Governor in Council appoints by notice in the *Gazette*, and all Cattle imported as aforesaid shall be landed at or on some Quarantine Ground to be appointed by an Inspector, and such Cattle shall be there detained for such period as the Chief Inspector appoints, not being less than Six months from the importation thereof: and every person who lands, or causes to be landed, any Cattle contrary to this provision shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty of not less than Fifty Pounds and not exceeding Two hundred Pounds.

Penalty for unlawfully removing Cattle from Quarantine Ground.

- Regulations.
- 7 If any person unlawfully removes any Cattle from any Quarantine Ground, or attempts so to do, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred Pounds nor more than Five hundred Pounds.
- 8 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind such Regulations as he sees fit for the following purposes:—
 - 1. For fixing the fees to be paid for the inspection of Cattle upon the importation thereof:

2. For the inspection, custody, and maintenance of Cattle placed A.D. 1880. in quarantine:

And it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to appoint by such Regulations such penalties not exceeding Fifty Pounds as the Governor in Council deems necessary for enforcing such Regulations; and all such Regulations shall be published in the Gazette as soon as may be after the making thereof, and laid before Parliament within Fourteen days after the meeting thereof.

9 Any Cattle conveyed or driven from any part of Tasmania to Persons deliver-Hobart Town and not taken into any slaughter-house or yard attached ing Cattle within thereto at *Hobart Town*, as provided by the Fourth Section of "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1861," shall be delivered only outside at *Hobart Town*, a radius of One chain from the public slaughter house, a radius of One chain from the public slaughter-house for the said liable to penalty. City; and if any Cattle are conveyed or driven within the said radius, such Cattle shall be delivered only into the said public slaughter-house and thereupon shall be subject to the provisions of the Fourth Section of the said Act; and any person who conveys, or drives, or delivers any Cattle contrary to this provision, shall, upon conviction, be liable to forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than Ten Pounds nor more than Fifty Pounds.

10 If any Cattle are at any time permitted or suffered to stray or be Cattle straying within the said radius, it shall be lawful for any person to drive such within radius how Cattle into the said public slaughter-house, and such Cattle shall there-dealt with. upon be subject to the provisions of the Fourth Section of the said Act; and the owner of the said Cattle shall be liable to a penalty of not less Penalty on owner. than One Pound nor more than Ten Pounds.

11 All fees for the inspection of any Cattle, and all charges for the Recovery of fees, maintenance of the same in any Quarantine Ground, and all penalties penalties, &c. imposed or made payable by this Act, or any Regulations made hereunder, shall be recovered in a summary way before Two Justices of the Peace in the mode prescribed by *The Magistrates Summary* Procedure Act.

12 All penalties, fees, and charges under this Act shall, where not Penalties to go otherwise appointed by this Act or the said Regulations, be paid into to Colonial the Colonial Treasury and form part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. Treasury.

13 "The Contagious Diseases (Cattle) Act, 1877," is hereby re-Repeal of pealed; but this repeal shall not affect any matter or thing duly done 41 Vict. No. 18. thereunder, or the punishment of any offence committed against the said Act before the commencement hereof.
