

AN ACT to amend "The Customs Duties A.D. 1890. Act, 1888." [31 *October*, 1890.]

W HEREAS it is expedient to alter certain Duties of Customs, and PREAMBLE. to impose further Duties of Customs:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Customs Duties Amendment Act, Short title. 1890." Short title. 52 Vict. No. 19.
- 2 On and after the Seventh day of August, one thousand eight Duty on Pork. hundred and ninety, there shall be raised, levied, collected, and paid upon the importation of Pork into Tasmania the several Duties set forth in the Schedule (1.) to this Act, in lieu of the Duty now payable thereon; and where Duty shall be payable ad valorem, such Duty shall be calculated on the true and real value of such Pork.

3 All Pork entered to be landed on and after the Seventh day of Pork landed on August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, shall be deemed to have been imported within the meaning of this Act, and shall be subject to Duty. subject and liable to the Duty hereby imposed.

Duty on Sheep and Cattle.

4 On and after the First day of *January*, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, there shall be raised, levied, collected, and paid upon the importation into *Tasmania* of the Animals mentioned in the Schedule (2.), the several Duties therein set forth.

Provision as to landing Sheep or Cattle. 25 Vict. No. 3.

5 Notwithstanding anything contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of *The Customs Act*, it shall not be lawful to land any of the Animals mentioned in the said Schedule (2.) without report or entry, except at such authorised landing-places as may be appointed by the Governor in that behalf.

In any case where such Animals shall have been landed without report or entry, the vessel from which such Animals have been landed may be detained by the Collector of Customs until all Duties in respect of such Animals have been paid to him; and in the event of such Duties not being paid within One month from such landing, every such vessel shall be forfeited.

Sheep and Cattle not to be bonded. 25 Viet. No. 3.

6—(1.) The Duties hereby imposed in respect of the Animals mentioned in the said Schedule (2.) shall be payable immediately on importation, and the provisions of *The Customs Act* as to bonding goods shall not apply to any such Animals.

Landed on 1st January, 1891, subject to Duty. (2.) All such Animals entered to be landed on or after the First day of January, 1891, shall be deemed to have been imported within the meaning of this Act, and shall be subject and liable to the Duty hereby imposed.

Acts to be read together.

7 This Act and "The Customs Duties Act, 1888," save so far as the same is altered or amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
