AN ACT to impose a Penalty for the Con- A.D. 1889. travention of certain Statutes.

[26 September, 1889.]

W HEREAS it is expedient to confer on Justices of the Peace the PREAMBLE. power to hear and determine in a summary manner Informations for such breaches of the Law as are hereinafter mentioned:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act, the word "Statute" shall mean an Act of the Interpretation. Imperial Parliament in force in Tasmania, and also an Act of the Parliament of Tasmania.

2 Every person who after the passing of this Act shall contravene Penalty for conany provision of any Statute for the contravention whereof no penalty travening any is by such Statute or by any other Statute prescribed, shall, upon con-Statute. viction thereof, either upon his own confession or upon proof before any Two or more Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions assembled, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds; and such penalty shall in every such case as aforesaid be recoverable in the mode prescribed by The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act.

Provided always, that if such Justices shall be of opinion that the offence is from any circumstance one that ought to be prosecuted by Information in the name of the Attorney-General or other officer appointed by the Governor to prosecute crimes, misdemeanors, and offences cognisable in the Supreme Court, such Justices shall, instead of summarily adjudicating thereupon, deal with such offence in all respects as if this Act had not been passed.

3 This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Contravention of Short title. Statutes Act, 1889."
