

AN ACT to amend An Act to amend the Law relating to Distillation. [20 February, 1867.]

W HEREAS it is desirable to amend The Distillation Prohibition PREAMBLE. Act: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of 29 Vict. No. 12. Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 In any information or complaint in respect of any offence under Averment in information Prohibition Act, it shall be sufficient to aver that any Spirits therein referred to are "Colonial Spirits," and upon the hearing are "Colonial Spirits information or complaint such averment shall be deemed Spirits." sufficient proof, unless the Defendant proves the contrary.

2 The Form (3) in the Schedule to the said Act is hereby repealed, Form of Licence and the Form in the Schedule hereto is substituted in lieu thereof.

3 This Act and the said Act, save as altered by this Act, shall be Acts to be read read and construed together as one and the same Act.

4 In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression Short Title. The Distillation Prohibition Act, No. 2.

Distillation Law Amendment.

SCHEDULE.

Whereas A. B., of [here insert residence of such person or the name and place of business of a Body Corporate] has applied to me in writing for a Licence to have, keep, and use a Still for the purpose of obtaining by Distillation from the indigenous vegetable productions of this Colony liquid products, not being low wines, feints, or spirits: And whereas I have this day also received the Fee payable for such Licence: I do therefore hereby grant to the said A. B. [or name of Body Corporate] license to have, keep, and use on his [or their] premises situate and being in [here describe locality], and not elsewhere, one Still [or as the case may be] for the purpose aforesaid, such Still [or each of such Stills] not being of a less capacity than One hundred and fifty gallons.
