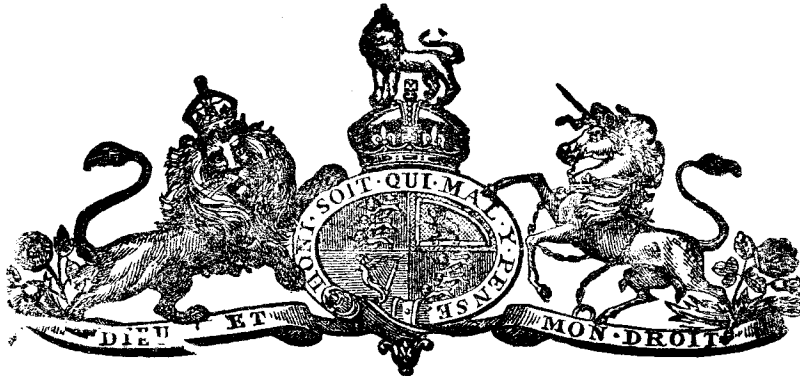

AN ACT to remove doubts as to the validity as an Act of Parliament of a certain Bill assented to by the Administrator of the Government, and as to the validity as Acts of Parliament of certain Bills assented to by the Governor. A.D. 1926.

[9 March, 1926.]

WHEREAS doubts have arisen as to the validity as an Act of Parliament of the Bill assented to by the Administrator of the Government, the title of which is set out in the first column of Schedule (1) to this Act, and as to the validity as Acts of Parliament of the two several Bills assented to by the Governor, the titles of which are set out in the first column of Schedule (2) to this Act :

And whereas it is desirable to remove such doubts :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as “The Doubts Removal Act, 1926.”

Validation as an Act of Parliament of a certain Bill assented to by the Administrator.

2 The Bill, the title of which is set out in the first column of Schedule (1) to this Act, passed or purporting to have been passed by both Houses of Parliament, and assented to by the Administrator of the Government on the date set out in the second column of the said schedule, and which said Bill, when so assented to as aforesaid, was deposited in the Supreme Court as an Act of Parliament bearing the regnal year and number set out in the third column of the said schedule, is hereby declared to have, and to have had from the date on which the same was so assented to as aforesaid, full force and effect as a valid Act of Parliament.

Validation as Acts of Parliament of certain Bills assented to by the Governor.

3 The two several Bills, the titles of which are set out in the first column of Schedule (2) to this Act, passed or purporting to have been passed by both Houses of Parliament, and assented to by the Governor on the respective dates set out in the second column of the said schedule opposite to the respective titles of the said Bills, and which said several Bills, when so assented to as aforesaid, were deposited in the Supreme Court as Acts of Parliament bearing the regnal years and numbers respectively set out in the third column of the said schedule opposite to the said respective titles are hereby declared to have, and to have had from the respective dates on which the same were so assented to as aforesaid, full force and effect as valid Acts of Parliament.
