

ANALYSIS.

Short title and incorporation with 1 Geo. V. No. 20.
Punishment for false declaration.

AN ACT to further amend "The Evidence Act, 1910." [8 February, 1917.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Evidence Act, 1917," and shall Short title and be construed as one with "The Evidence Act, 1910," hereinafter incorporation with referred to as "the Principal Act."

- 2 After Section One hundred and thirty-two of the Principal Act, the following section is inserted:—
- "132a Any person who wilfully makes any declaration by virtue of the immediately preceding section, knowing such declaration to be untrue in any material particular, shall be guilty of a misdemeanour, and shall be liable, upon conviction thereof, to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Five years."
