AN ACT to further amend The Electoral Act. [11 October, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend The Electoral Act: Be it PREAMBLE. therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The boundaries of the Town of Launceston, as from time to time by Boundaries of the Law defined, shall for all purposes be deemed to have been and to be the Electoral District boundaries of the Electoral District of Launceston.

2 The Electoral Roll, or document purporting to be the Electoral Electoral Rolls Roll, of any Electoral District for the year commencing the Eleventh not invalidated by day of April, 1867, or for any subsequent year, shall not be deemed to delay in printing be, or be, in any manner invalidated or be questioned by reason solely that the List of Electors for such District was not copied and printed in a Book, and such Book signed and delivered to the Returning Officer of such District on or before the Tenth day of April as required by The Electoral Act, anything in the said Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

3 The Clerks of the Peace at Launceston and Hobart Town are Indemnity for hereby freed and discharged from all suits and proceedings whatsoever, delay. to which they or either of them might otherwise be liable by reason of any such delay as aforesaid in copying and printing any such List of Electors for any Electoral District in a Book, and signing and delivering such Book to the Returning Officer of such District on or before the

Electoral Act, No. 3.

Tenth day of *April*, 1867, or in any subsequent year, unless such delay in any case arises from the neglect or default of the said Clerks of the Peace respectively.

Acts to be read together.

4 This Act and The Electoral Act and The Electoral Act, No. 2, except in so far as the said Acts or either of them are or is inconsistent with this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

Short Title.

5 This Act may be cited as "The Electoral Act, No. 3."
