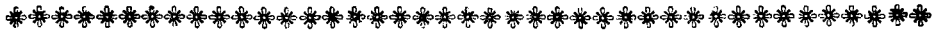

AN ACT to provide for the Inspection and Regulation of the Fisheries of *Tasmania*.  
[24 November, 1884.]

A.D. 1884.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The Governor in Council is hereby empowered from time to time to appoint a fit and proper person of guaranteed scientific attainments as and to be "Superintendent and Inspector of Fisheries," who shall, under the direction and control of the Chief Secretary, act as scientific adviser to the Government of *Tasmania* in all matters relating to the development and regulation of the Fisheries thereof, and who shall perform in connection therewith such other duties as may be prescribed by Regulations made under this Act.

Superintendent and Inspector of Fisheries may be appointed.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make and issue Regulations defining the duties of the Superintendent and Inspector of Fisheries; and all such Regulations shall on publication in the *Hobart Gazette* have the full force of Law; and a copy thereof shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament within Fourteen days after the making thereof, if Parliament be then in Session, and if not, then within Fourteen days after the commencement of the next ensuing Session.

**3** The Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Hobart Gazette*, upon the Superintendent and Inspector of Fisheries reporting that it is desirable that means should be adopted for the preservation of any of the Fish of *Tasmania*, apply the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of *Tasmania* of the 23rd *Victoria*, No. 10, to any such Fish other than the Mullet or Herring; and upon the publication of such Proclamation as aforesaid, all the provisions of the said Act shall apply to the Fish mentioned in such Proclamation in the same manner in all respects as if the term "Mullet" used in the said Act included such Fish.

**4** This Act may be cited as "The Fisheries Inspection Act, 1884."
