AN ACT to amend "The Friendly Societies A.D. 1888. Act, 1888." [24 October, 1888.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend "The Friendly Societies Act, PREAMBLE. 51 Vict. No. 1888," in certain particulars:

51 Vict. No. 16.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 In this Act the expression "the said Act" shall mean "The Friendly Interpretation. Societies Act, 1888."
- 2 All moneys hereafter paid by any Friendly Society or Branch to Moneys paid to the Curator of Intestate Estates upon the death of any member of such Curator and not Society, and for which no legal claimant can be found within the time claimed to be during which the Curator is authorised by Law to retain such moneys Society. before paying the same into the Treasury, shall, upon the expiration of that time, and after payment thereout of all charges which the Curator is authorised to deduct therefrom, be paid by the Curator to the Society or Branch from which the same were received by him, and shall be carried by such Society or Branch to the account of the fund out of which the same were originally paid, and shall thereafter form part of that fund, and as such become and remain the absolute property of such Society or Branch.

- 3 This Act and the said Act, save as amended by this Act, shall be Acts to be read read and construed together as one Act.
- 4 This Act may be cited as "The Friendly Societies Amendment Short title. \mathbf{A} ct.''
