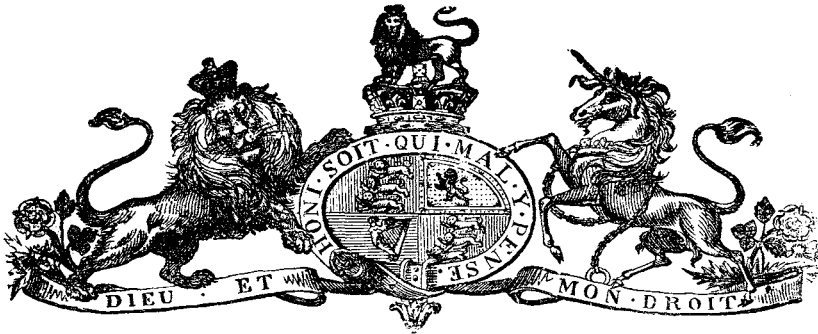

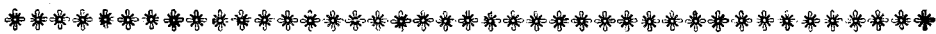

AN ACT to amend "The Friendly Societies Act, 1888." [24 October, 1888.] A.D. 1888.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend "The Friendly Societies Act, 1888," in certain particulars: PREAMBLE. 51 Vict. No. 16.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act the expression "the said Act" shall mean "The Friendly Societies Act, 1888." Interpretation.

2 All moneys hereafter paid by any Friendly Society or Branch to the Curator of Intestate Estates upon the death of any member of such Society, and for which no legal claimant can be found within the time during which the Curator is authorised by Law to retain such moneys before paying the same into the Treasury, shall, upon the expiration of that time, and after payment thereof of all charges which the Curator is authorised to deduct therefrom, be paid by the Curator to the Society or Branch from which the same were received by him, and shall be carried by such Society or Branch to the account of the fund out of which the same were originally paid, and shall thereafter form part of that fund, and as such become and remain the absolute property of such Society or Branch. Moneys paid to Curator and not claimed to be returned to Society.

3 This Act and the said Act, save as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

4 This Act may be cited as "The Friendly Societies Amendment Act." Short title.
