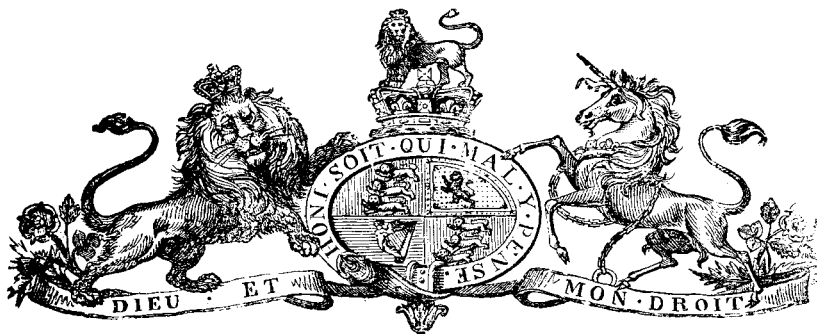

AN ACT to amend "The Gunpowder Act, A.D. 1888. 1875." [8 October, 1888.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Gunpowder Amendment Act, 1888." Short title.

2 In this Act the expression "the said Act" shall mean "The Gunpowder Act, 1875." Interpretation. 39 Vict. No. 8.

3 Section Six of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Six of the said Act, (that is to say) :— Provision substituted for Section 6 of 39 Vict. No. 8.

"All gunpowder imported into this Colony shall, save as otherwise provided, be landed at such places as shall be prescribed at or near the Port of *Hobart* or *Launceston*, or at or near any other Port the Governor in Council may appoint, and not elsewhere; and the Governor in Council may prescribe the limits within which any ship or vessel having more than Twenty-five pounds of gunpowder on board arriving within the River *Derwent* or *Tamar*, or at or near any such Port appointed as aforesaid, shall not be permitted to anchor."

Gunpowder Amendment.

Provision substituted for Sect. 7 of 39 Vict. No. 8.

4 Section Seven of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Seven of the said Act, (that is to say) :—

“ The master of any vessel arriving at *Hobart* or *Launceston*, or at any port appointed as aforesaid, having gunpowder on board exceeding the quantity of Twenty-five pounds in weight, shall hoist a Union-jack at the main of such vessel, and keep the same hoisted until such gunpowder has been duly landed at the place prescribed ; and if any vessel is moored or anchored within the prescribed limits before all the gunpowder on board exceeding that quantity has been placed in the custody of the storekeeper of the public magazine where the same shall arrive, and conformably with such regulations, if any, as are for the time being in force for that purpose, the master of such vessel shall forfeit a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds.”

5 Section Eight of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Eight of the said Act, (that is to say) :—

“ The master of any vessel arriving within the River *Derwent* or *Tamar*, or at or near any port appointed as aforesaid, with gunpowder on board, whether as stores or cargo, shall specially report the same to the boarding officer or pilot, whichever shall first go on board such vessel ; and if any gunpowder be not so reported it shall be forfeited ; and the master neglecting or omitting to make such report shall for such neglect or omission forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding One hundred Pounds.”

Acts to be read together.

6 This Act and the said Act, save so far as the same may be altered or amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
