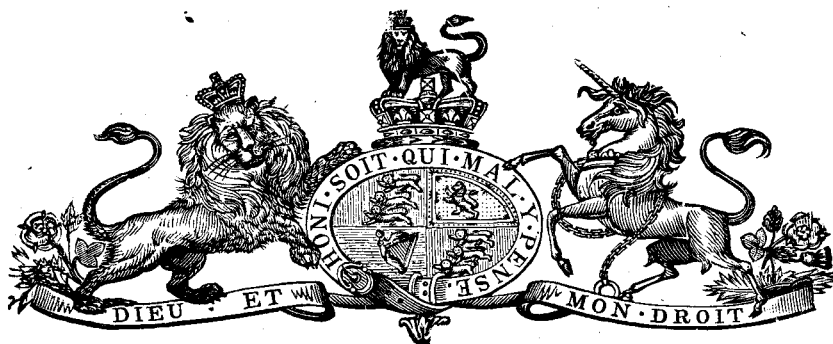

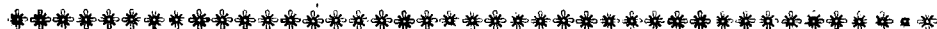

AN ACT to further amend "The Game Protection Act, 1895." [30 December, 1901.] A.D. 1901.

WHEREAS it is expedient that "The Game Protection Act, 1895," should be further amended in certain particulars: PREAMBLE. 59 Vict. No. 26.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Game Protection Amendment Act, 1901." Short title.

2 In this Act, the expression "the said Act" shall mean "The Game Protection Act, 1895." Interpretation. 59 Vict. No. 26.

3 Every person who, within the period of Two years from the commencement of this Act, shoots at or wilfully kills or captures, or has in his possession or control, any Wattle Bird (*Anthochaera inauris*), or takes, destroys, or offers for sale the eggs of any Wattle Bird (*Anthochaera inauris*), shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty Shillings. Penalty for killing certain birds.

Schedule (2.) of

4 The following words are added at the end of the Schedule (2.) of the said Act, and the said Act shall be read as if such words had originally been added at the end of the said Schedule (2.); that is to say:—

“65. *Dacelo gigas* (Giant Kingfisher, or Laughing Jackass of Australia.)

5 This Act and the said Act, and every Act amending the same, save as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
