

AN ACT to make provision for the Salary of 1927. the Governor of the State, and for other purposes.

[Reserved, 28th July, 1927; Royal Assent proclaimed, 16th August, 1927.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Governor's Salary Act, 1927," Short title. and shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

2—(1) There shall be payable to the Governor of the State for the period of six months ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, salary at the rate of Two thousand seven hundred and fifty Pounds per annum. Such salary shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue, which, to the necessary extent, is hereby appropriated accordingly. The sum aforesaid shall include all provision for the salary and allowances for the Private Secretary to the Governor, and the travelling expenses of the Governor.

(2) For the purposes of this section the travelling expenses of the Governor shall not be deemed to include fares for any Governor of the State, or any member of his family or staff, nor the cost of providing, or the hire of, any special train for the conveyance of any Governor of the

State, on any railway the property of the State.

Government House to be kept in repair and furnished throughout.

3 The Government House, together with all necessary outbuildings and appurtenances, shall during the period of six months mentioned in Section Two of this Act be kept in repair, and the residential portion thereof shall be kept furnished throughout, and the cost thereof shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament out of the Consolidated Revenue.
