

AN ACT to provide for the Sale of a School Reserve at Swansea, to the Trustees of the Glamorgan War Memorial Committee.

[13 March, 1924.] W HEREAS the land (being Crown land) described in the schedule PREAMBLE.

to this Act was reserved, and has long been used by the Education Department as a school reserve, but is no longer required by the Department for school purposes: And whereas the said Department has agreed with Edward Bernard Shaw, William Arnol, and George Musgrave Parker the duly appointed trustees of the Glamorgan War Memorial Committee for the sale to them of the said piece of land for the sum of Two hundred Pounds, and it is desirable to give effect to the said agreement:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and

House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Glamorgan School Site Sale Short title. Enabling Act, 1924."

Glamorgan School Site Sale Enabling.

A.D. 1924.

Validation of agreement to sell.

2 Upon payment by the said Edward Bernard Shaw, William Arnol, and George Musgrave Parker to the Minister of Education of the said sum of Two hundred Pounds together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, it shall be lawful for the Governor in the name of, and on behalf of, His Majesty, to convey and alienate the said land to the said Edward Bernard Shaw, William Arnol, and George Musgrave Parker in fee simple.

Disposition of purchase money. 49 Vic. No. 15.

3 The said sum of Two hundred Pounds shall be paid into and form part of the fund established by and under the provisions of "The Education Act, 1885."

TOWN OF SWANSEA.

SECTION F. Oa. 1r. 3 p.

War Memorial Reserve.

All that piece or parcel of land situated in the Town of Swansea in the County of Glamorgan in the State of Tasmania containing 1 rood 35 perches or thereabouts and bounded on the north-east by 1 chain 51 links south-easterly along Franklin-street commencing at the angle of that street with Noyes-street on the south-east by 2 chains 82 links south-westerly along 2 acres 2 roods and 28 perches granted to William Hepburn on the south-west by 1 chain 93 6/10 links north-westerly along a municipal reserve and thence on the north-west by 2 chains 67 3/10 links north-easterly along Noyes-street aforesaid to the point of commencement.
