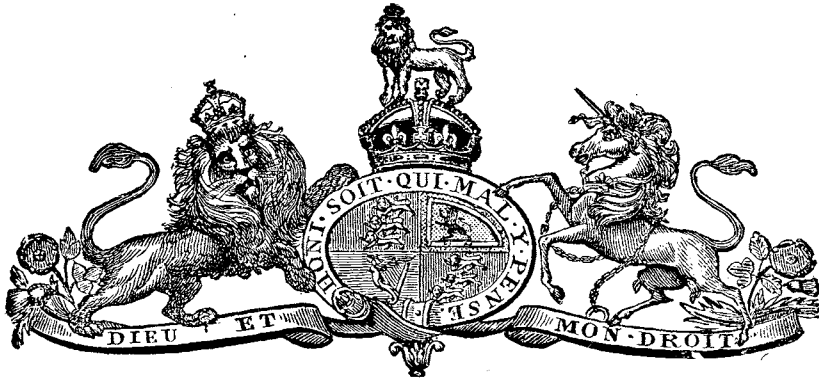

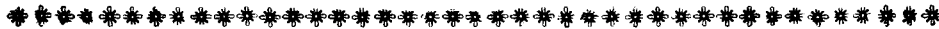

AN ACT to entitle the Widow and Children A.D.  
1923.  
of Trooper *Frederick George Henderson*,  
deceased, to receive Pensions.

[29 March, 1923.]

**W**HEREAS Trooper *Frederick George Henderson*, a member of Preamble.  
the Police Force of Tasmania, was killed at or near Swansea, in  
Tasmania, on the Eleventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred  
and twenty-two, whilst in the execution of his duty :

*Henderson Family Pensions.*

And whereas the said trooper left him surviving and inadequately provided for his widow *Alice Maud Henderson* and Five young children, *Adam Herald Henderson*, born on the Twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, *Andrew Henderson*, born on the Fifth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, *Brenda Agnes Henderson*, born on the Eighteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, *Jack Alexandria Henderson*, born on the Eighth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and *Marjorie Isabella Henderson*, born on the Tenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty :

And whereas it is desirable that pensions should be granted to the said widow and children :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Short title.

**1** This Act may be cited as “The *Henderson* Family Pensions Act, 1923.”

Annual pension of £75 to widow.

**2** There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue to the said *Alice Maud Henderson* an annual pension of Seventy-five Pounds during her present widowhood.

Annual pension of £20 to each of Five children.

**3** An annual pension of Twenty Pounds is hereby granted to each of the said children, *Adam Herald Henderson*, *Andrew Henderson*, *Brenda Agnes Henderson*, *Jack Alexandria Henderson*, and *Marjorie Isabella Henderson*.

The pension hereby granted to any such child shall cease upon the child attaining the age of Eighteen years. The pension of each such child shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue to the Public Trustee, on behalf of the grantee thereof, and the Public Trustee shall, in his discretion, expend such pension or cause the same to be expended, as he shall think fit, for or towards the maintenance, support, or education, or otherwise for the benefit of the grantee thereof :

Provided that the Public Trustee may, in his discretion, from time to time, pay any such pension to the said *Alice Maud Henderson*, to be applied by her for any of the purposes aforesaid, and in such case the Public Trustee shall not be required to see to the application thereof, or be responsible for the misapplication thereof.

Pensions to be payable monthly.

**4** The several pensions abovementioned shall be payable monthly as from the Twelfth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

Annual pension of £20 to any posthumous child.

**5** If after the passing of this Act any posthumous child or children shall be born to the said *Frederick George Henderson* deceased by his said widow, the said *Alice Maud Henderson*, there shall be payable in respect of each such child, as from the date of the birth thereof, an annual pension of Twenty Pounds, and all the provisions of this Act

relating to the several pensions granted by this Act to the beforenamed children of the said *Frederick George Henderson* deceased, born in his lifetime, shall, subject as in this section mentioned, apply to any pension which shall be payable to any such posthumous child to be born as aforesaid. A.D. 1923.

**6** The Governor shall, from time to time, issue his warrant to the Treasurer for the payment of the said pensions payable under this Act, and the same shall thereupon be paid by the Treasurer to the persons respectively entitled to receive payment thereof under this Act, or to such other persons as the persons so entitled as aforesaid, by writing under their respective hands, may respectively appoint to receive the same. Treasurer to pay pensions upon Governor's warrant.

**7** It shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand in case of the death, during the currency of any month, of any person entitled to a pension under this Act, to direct payment to be made to the Public Trustee of a proportionate part of the pension of such deceased person up to the day of the death of the deceased person, to be by the Public Trustee utilised and expended in his discretion for the benefit of any surviving child or children of the said *Frederick George Henderson*, deceased. In case of death, proportion of pension to be paid.

**8** The pensions payable under this Act to, or for the benefit of, the said widow and children of the said *Frederick George Henderson*, deceased, shall be in full satisfaction of any claim under "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1918," which the said widow or children, or any of them, or the legal personal representative of the said *Frederick George Henderson*, or any other person, might, but for this section, have had against the Crown in respect of the Government of this State, by reason or in consequence of the death of the said *Frederick George Henderson*, having been caused by accident arising out of, and in the course of, his employment in the service of the Crown. Pensions to be in satisfaction of any claim under "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1918." 9 Geo. V. No. 40.

Nothing in this section shall affect any right which such widow, or children, or any of them, or such legal personal representative may have in consequence of the death of the said *Frederick George Henderson*, to receive or participate in any moneys payable to such widow, or children, or any of them or to such legal personal representative out of "The Police Provident Fund" established under "The Police Regulation Act, 1898." Rights under "The Police Regulation Act, 1898," not to be affected. 62 Vict. No. 48.
