

#### AN ACT to further amend The Hobart Town [27 December, 1872.] Water Act, 1860.

W HEREAS the present supply of Water to the City of Hobart PREAMBLE. Town and the Suburbs thereof is inadequate and insufficient, and it is expedient to add to the Sources of Supply mentioned in the Fifth Section 24 Vict, No. 9. of The Hobart Town Water Act, 1860:

And whereas it has been found necessary to raise a further sum of Five thousand Pounds for the purposes of the said Act and this Act over and above the sum of Fifty thousand Pounds mentioned in the said Act, and over and above the sum of Ten thousand Pounds mentioned in *The Hobart Town Water Act*, 1863, and over and above 27 Vict. No. 19. the sum of Five thousand Pounds mentioned in "The Hobart Town 31 Vict. No. 40. Water Act, 1867 :'

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :----

1 The following streams shall, in addition to those mentioned in the Further source Fifth Section of The Hobart Town Water Act, 1860, constitute further of supply.

sources of the supply of water for the purposes of the said Act :---All streams flowing from Mount Wellington towards the direct Huon Road from Hobart to Leslie commencing at the Fern Tree Creek and extending to the Plains Rivulet and five chains to the west thereof (excepting a stream known as Millhouse's or

Falls Creek), such point on the Plains Rivulet being distant about sixty chains above its junction with the North West Bay River.

Power to borrow £5000.

Government may

guarantee interest.

2 It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council of the City of Hobart Town to borrow on mortgage such sum or sums of money not exceeding Five thousand Pounds (over and above the said several sums of Fifty thousand Pounds, Ten thousand Pounds, and Five thousand Pounds) as the said Council deems necessary for the purposes of The Klobart Town Water Act, 1860, and this Act, and to make and grant mortgages of the several rates and charges to be levied and paid under the authority of the first-mentioned Act, in security of the payment of the money so borrowed and interest thereon under the provisions of this Act.

**3** In order to facilitate the borrowing by the said Municipal Council of the said sum of Five thousand Pounds for the purposes aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Colonial Government to guarantee the payment of interest upon the same or any part thereof to the lenders : Provided always, that in every such case, and so far as the Colonial Government in consequence of such guarantee advances and pays any sum of money to any such lender, all moneys so paid shall be, and the same are hereby declared to be, a first or primary charge upon the rates and charges to be received by the said Council under the authority of the said firstmentioned Act.

Savings' Banks may invest in such loan.

Acts to be read together.

Short title.

**4** It shall be lawful for the Trustees for the time being of any Bank for Savings in *Tasmania* now established, or hereafter to be established, to advance and lend to the said Municipal Council upon the security aforesaid any part of the said sum of Five thousand Pounds which the Council is authorised to borrow under this Act, anything in the Act of Council of the 12th *Victoria*, No. 1, to the contrary notwithstanding.

5 This Act, The Hobart Town Water Act, 1860, The Hobart Town Water Act, 1863, and "The Hobart Town Water Act, 1867," shall save so far as the same or any of them may be altered by this Act, be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

6 This Act may be cited as "The Hobart Town Water Act, 1872.'
