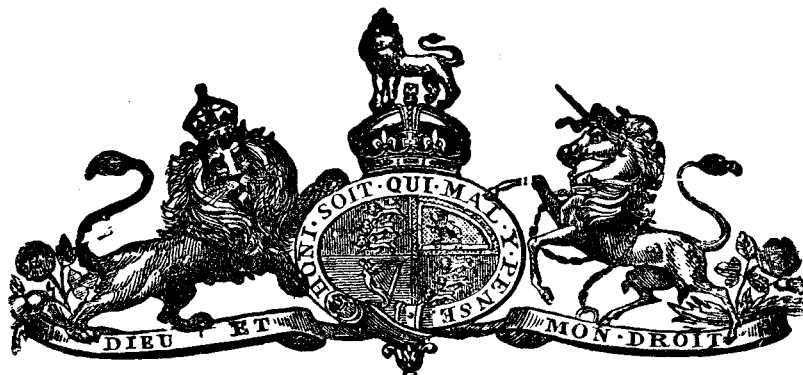

1. Short title.
2. Amendment of Section 21 of the Indeterminate Sentences Act, 1921.

AN ACT to amend the Indeterminate Sentences Act, 1921. [16 December, 1925.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Indeterminate Sentences Act, 1925.” Short title.

2 Section Twenty-one of the Indeterminate Sentences Act, 1921, is hereby amended, as follows:—

- I. As to Subsection (1) thereof by deleting the word “Three” in the second line of the said subsection, and substituting the word “Four” therefor;
- II. As to Subsection (3) thereof by deleting the word “Two” in the first line of the said subsection, and substituting the word “Three” therefor: and
- III. By expunging Subsection (4) thereof, and substituting the following subsection therefor:—

“ (4) Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum.”
