AN ACT to authorise the borrowing and 1922. raising of a Sum not exceeding Three hundred and fifty thousand Pounds. [4 November, 1922.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :---

1 This Act may be cited as "The Loans Act (No. 1), 1922-23."

2 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer for the time being of the State Treasurer author to borrow. raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Three hundred ised to borrow and fifty thousand Pounds for the purposes mentioned in the Schedule $\pounds 350,000$. to this Act.

The said sum to be borrowed under "The State Securities Act, 1918" (9 Geo. V. No. 8), with certain modifications. 3-(1) The said sum shall be borrowed and raised by the Treasurer under and subject to the provisions of "The State Securities Act, 1918," save and except that the rate of interest to be paid in respect thereof shall not exceed Five Pounds Ten Shillings per centum per annum, and the security to be issued by the Treasurer therefor shall be redeemable not later than Ten years from the date of such issue.

(2) "The State Securities Act, 1918," as expressly modified or altered by this section, shall be incorporated and read as one with this Act.
