AN ACT to amend the Law relating to Larceny. [1 August, 1894.] A.D. 1894.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to Larceny by persons employed to collect money : PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Larceny Act, 1894," and the Acts of the Parliament of Tasmania of the 27th Victoria, No. 8, 40th Victoria, No. 8, 41st Victoria, No. 13, and this Act, may be cited as "The Larceny Acts, 1863 to 1894." 2 Whosoever, being employed or authorised by any other person to demand, sue for, or recover any debt or sum of money due or payable to such other person, shall in any manner fraudulently apply or dispose of any moneys received by him in respect of such debt or sum of money, or any part thereof, or any valuable security received by him in respect of such debt or sum of money, or any part thereof, to his own use or to the use of some person other than such first-mentioned person, shall be deemed to be guilty of Larceny, and being convicted thereof shall be punishable accordingly : Provided, that no charge shall be laid against any person under this Act without the consent of the Attorney-General or Solicitor-General having been previously obtained thereto. Person employed to collect money fraudulently applying same to his own use guilty of Larceny.

3 This Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with "The Larceny Acts, 1863 to 1894," and shall be construed as if the said Acts (except such parts thereof as have been repealed) and this Act were one Act. Acts to be read together.
