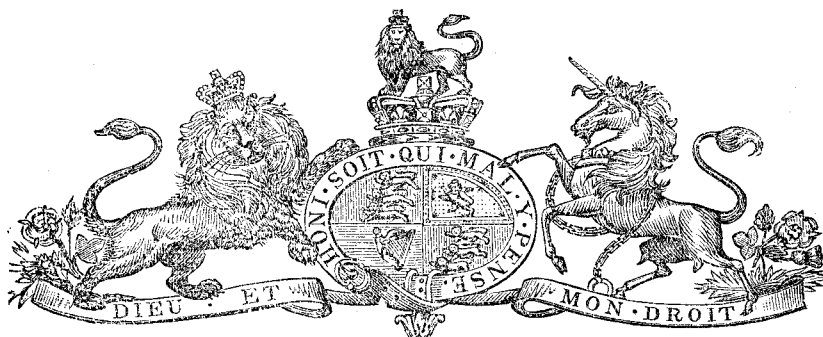

AN ACT to amend "The Lotteries Act, 1878." [17 November, 1891.] A.D. 1891.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Lotteries Act, 1878," in manner hereinafter appearing: PREAMBLE. 42 Vict. No. 17.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Lotteries Amendment Act, 1891." Short title.

2 In this Act the expression "the said Act" shall mean and include "The Lotteries Act, 1878." Interpretation.

3 The provisions of the said Act shall not apply to any raffle of a private nature which is not advertised by public advertisement or any written or printed notice. Provisions of 42 Vict. No. 17 not to apply to private raffles.

4 The instrument known as the totalisator, when used by the direction or with the permission of any duly recognised racing club, or the committee of management of any public regatta, upon any public race-course or public regatta-ground, shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act. Use of totalisator allowed at races and regattas.

Provided, that no such club or committee shall charge or permit to be charged more than ten per centum on any moneys placed in the totalisator.

5 This Act and the said Act shall be read together as one and the same Act. Acts to be read together.
