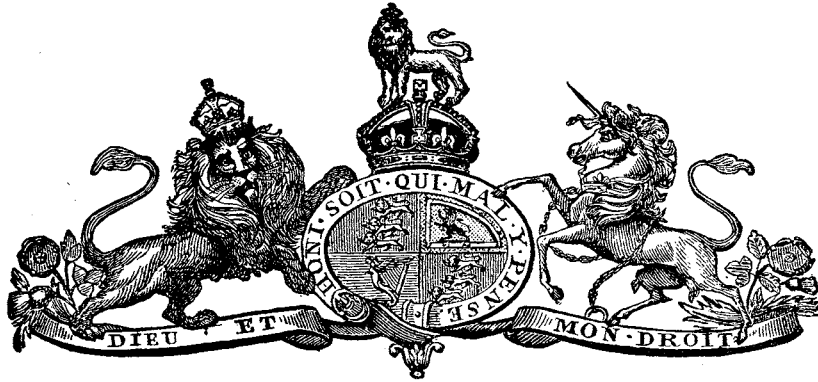

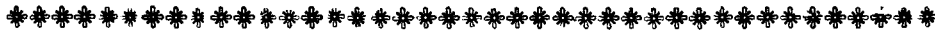

AN ACT to further amend "The Lotteries Amendment Act, 1899." [29 September, 1904.] A.D. 1904.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Lotteries Amendment Act, Short Title. 1904."

2 Section Six of "The Lotteries Amendment Act, 1899," is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be, and may be cited as Section Six of that Act, that is to say:—

6 Out of moneys retained by any Committee or Stewards as and by way of commission on any money placed in or upon the Totalisator, there shall be payable and paid by such Committee or Stewards to the Treasurer of the State towards the Consolidated Revenue Fund, a sum equal to One Pound per centum of the total sum of money placed in 4d.] Appropriation.

or upon the Totalisator, and the balance, after deducting the cost of working the Totalisator, shall be appropriated solely for the purposes of promoting horse-racing on the racecourse on which such Totalisator has been conducted, or for maintaining and improving the racecourse.

Provided that the proprietors of any racecourse may appropriate a moiety of such balance to cover the cost of the purchase and preparation of such racecourse and the erection of buildings thereon until such cost shall have been liquidated."

**3** In addition to the information required to be given by Section Nine of "The Lotteries Amendment Act, 1899," the Committee or Stewards shall set forth in the Declaration mentioned in that Section—

- i. The total amount of money passed through the Totalisator :
- ii. The total amount of money paid in dividends :
- iii. The total amount of money retained by way of commission :
- iv. The total amount of money retained by way of broken money.

**4** "The Lotteries Amendment Act, 1899," and this Act shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
