

AN ACT to further amend The Licensing Act. A.D. 1887. [20 December, 1887.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to further amend The Licensing Act: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 Whenever Justices shall, in execution of the provisions of the If drunkard Thirty-second Section of "The Licensing Amendment Act, No. 6," obtain liquor, have prohibited the sale of Liquor to any such person as therein provided, liable to penalty. a copy of such notice of prohibition shall be served on such person; and if such person, after service of such notice as aforesaid, shall during such prohibition purchase or procure, or attempt to purchase or procure, any such Liquor for his own use, he shall in any and every such case forfeit upon conviction a sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings.

2 Whenever Justices shall, in execution of the provisions of "The Justices may Licensing Amendment Act, No. 6," have prohibited the sale of Liquor cancel prohibition. to any such person as therein provided, it shall be lawful for any Two Justices, one of whom shall be a member of a Licensing Bench in Petty Sessions assembled, upon the application of such person by writing under their hands in the form in the Schedule, to cancel such prohibition before the expiration thereof if such person has, in their opinion, reformed at the time of such application, and thereupon such prohibition shall cease to be of any force or effect.

Licensing Amendment.

Imprisonment where penalty not paid. 21 Vict. No. 39. 3 Where any person may be adjudged to pay a penalty for selling Liquor without a Licence under the Second Section of *The Licensing* Act, such person in case of non-payment thereof may, without any warrant of distress, be committed to prison for any term, with or without hard labour, not exceeding the period specified in the following scale, unless such penalty shall be sooner paid-

For any Penalty	to exceed
Not exceeding Twenty Pounds	Six Months.
Exceeding Twenty Pounds and not exceeding Fifty Pounds	Nine Months.
Exceeding Fifty Pounds and not exceeding One hun-	
dred Pounds	Twelve Months.

Acts to be read together.

4 The Licensing Act, and every Act amending the same, save as amended, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.

Short Title.

5 This Act may be cited as "The Licensing Amendment Act, No. 7."

SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS on the day of and two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, did, by Notice under their hands, forbid any person holding a Public House Licence who should be served with a copy of such Notice, or should acquire a knowledge thereof in any other manner, to sell or supply to A.B. any Liquor for the space of one year from the date of such notice. And whereas the coid A.B. has applied to us two of Her Mojestr's Justices of the Peace to consell said A.B. has applied to us, two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, to cancel the said Notice. AND WHEREAS the said A.B. has in our opinion reformed. We do therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of "The Licensing Amendment Act, No. 7," cancel the said Notice.
