

ACT to amend "The Launceston and A.D. 1883. ANWestern Railway Act, 1873." [29 October, 1883.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 It shall be lawful for the Minister of Lands and Works for the Power to lay time being to lay down or cause to be laid down an additional Rail or down additional Rails upon and along any part or parts of the Launceston and Western Rail. Railway, so as to enable such Railway to be used for engines and rolling-stock constructed for a gauge of Three feet and Six inches, and for that purpose to make such alterations in the said Railway as may be necessary.

- 2 The cost of laying down such additional Rail or Rails, and of Cost how borne. making such alterations as are hereinbefore mentioned, and of generally effecting the purposes of this Act, shall be appropriated out of moneys provided by Parliament for that purpose; but such cost shall not exceed the sum of Nineteen thousand Pounds.
- 3 Nothing hereinbefore contained shall in any way affect any rights Rights of of The Launceston and Western Railway Company (Limited) under Company saved. Section Twenty-four of "The Launceston and Western Railway Act, 1873."
- 4 "The Launceston and Western Railway Act, 1873," as amended by Acts to be read this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
- 5 This Act may be cited as "The Launceston and Western Railway Short title. Act, 1883."
