

AN ACT to provide for the Sale and Dis- A.D. 1900. posal of certain Crown Land. [15 December, 1900.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Lands Disposal Act, 1900."

Short title.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Power to grant Her Majesty the Queen, to convey and alienate the land described in land to Wm. Schedule (1.) hereto, to William Robertson, James Andrew Robertson, others. and George Albert Robertson, their heirs, and assigns, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest.

3-(1.) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to Power to sell to sell by private contract to the Marine Board of Strahan, the land Marine Board of described in Schedule (2.) hereto, for the sum of Ten Pounds to be paid in cash within Six months from the date of this Act.

(2.) Upon payment of such sum of money it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to convey and alienate to the said Marine Board, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest, the said piece of land described in the said Schedule (2.)

Power to exchange certain land at Bellerine.

4—(1.) Upon the owner for the time being of the land described in Schedule (3.) hereto surrendering such land to Her Majesty the Queen, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, to convey and alienate the land described in the Schedule (4.) hereto, to such owner, his heirs, and assigns, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest.

(2.) Upon the owner for the time being of the land described in Schedule (5.) hereto, surrendering such land to Her Majesty the Queen, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, to convey and alienate the land described in Schedule (6.) hereto, to such owner, his heirs, and assigns, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest.

Power to sell certain land at Zechan to John Armstrong and others.

- 5—(1.) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell by private contract to John Armstrong, Charles Brumby, and Murdoch M'Lennan, as trustees, the land described in Schedule (7.) hereto, for the sum of Ninety-one Pounds, to be paid in instalments in like proportions to the terms set forth in Schedule (2.) to "The Crown Lands Act, 1890."
- (2.) Upon payment as aforesaid of such sum of money, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to convey and alienate to the said John Armstrong, Charles Brumby, and Murdoch M'Lennan, their heirs, and assigns, as trustees, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest, the said piece of land described in the said Schedule (7.)

Power to grant land to James Nimmo.

6 It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, to convey and alienate the land described in the Schedule (8.), hereto, to James Nimmo, his heirs and assigns, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest, reserving to Her Majesty Her heirs and Successors the roads referred to as reserved roads in the said Schedule (8.) hereto.

Power to sell certain land in vicinity of Zeehan to Tasmanian Smelting Company.

- **7**—(1.) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell by private contract to the Tasmanian Smelting Company, Limited, the land described in Schedule (9.) hereto, for the sum of Fifty Pounds.
- (2.) Upon payment as aforesaid of such sum of money, and upon bond fide improvements having been made upon the said land for residence purposes to the satisfaction of the said Commissioner, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to convey and alienate to the said Company and its assigns, in fee simple or for any less estate or interest, the said piece of land described in the said Schedule (9.).
