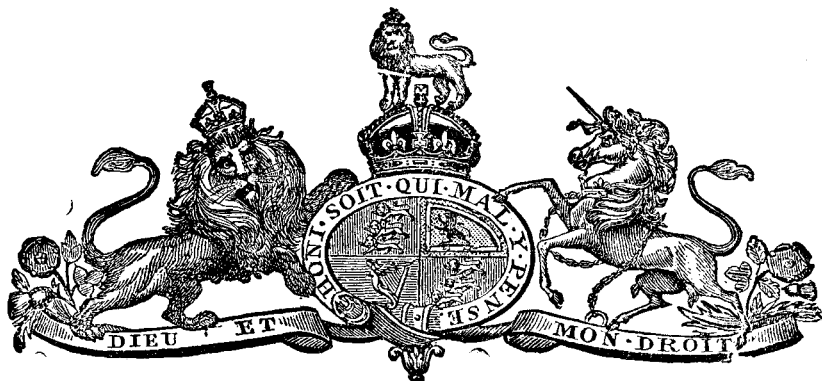

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AN ACT to amend the Local Government Act, 1906. [23 December, 1932.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Local Government Act, 1932.”

No. 31.**2** The Principal Act is hereby amended—

I. By inserting after the word “municipality” in the last line of Section Thirty-four thereof the words “and no elector shall be eligible to be nominated for election or to be elected as such councillor unless on or before the last day prescribed for his nomination all rates and charges in respect of any property within the municipality, for payment of which he alone is liable, have been paid” :

II. By deleting the word “six” in the second line of Section Seventy-five thereof and substituting therefor the word “seven” : and

III. By deleting the word “township” in the fifteenth line of Paragraph i. of Division (12) of Section Two hundred and five thereof and substituting therefor the word “town.”

**3**—(1) The power to prohibit the carriage of timber over certain roads conferred upon councils by Paragraph XIII. of Division (10) of Section Two hundred and five of the Principal Act (inserted by the Local Government Act, 1930) may be exercised in cases of emergency as hereinafter provided without the passing of a by-law for that purpose.

(2) In any such case as aforesaid, the council shall pass a resolution prohibiting the carriage of timber, or of timber of any specified class, as the case may require, over any road or portion of a road specified in such resolution during a period therein specified, and shall transmit a copy of such resolution to the Minister for the approval of the Governor.

(3) The Governor, upon being satisfied that the circumstances are such as to warrant the immediate application of the prohibition contained in such resolution, may give his approval thereto.

(4) Upon receipt of such approval, the council shall give public notice of such resolution in the Gazette and in a newspaper, and thereupon the same shall have effect for the period therein specified as if the same had been contained in a by-law passed by such council.
