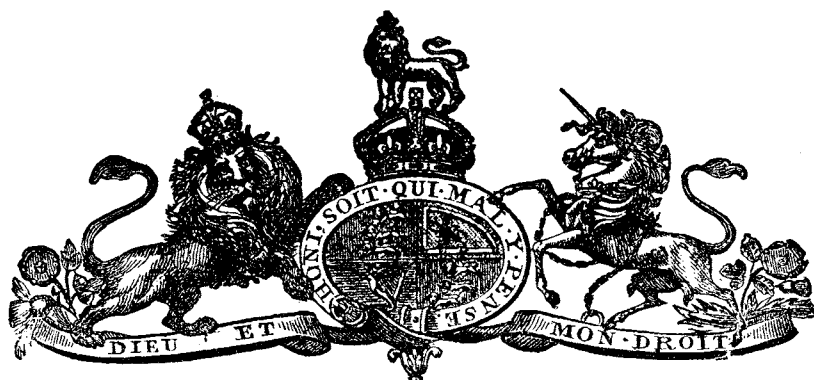

AN ACT to repeal the Launceston Technical School Trustees Act, 1900, and to vest in the Council of the Launceston Technical College certain property held by the Trustees of the Launceston Technical School for the benefit of the said School.

WHEREAS by the Launceston Technical School Trustees Act, 1900, there was constituted as a body corporate a Board of Trustees under the name of the Trustees of the Launceston Technical School, and there was vested in the Trustees, for the benefit of the said School, certain personal property therein specified and such other personal property as might from time to time be acquired by the Trustees for the purposes of the said School:

PREAMBLE.

And whereas it is desirable to dissolve the said body corporate and to vest the property held by the Trustees as aforesaid in the Council of the Launceston Technical College:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as “The Launceston Technical School Trustees Act, 1930.”

2 The Launceston Technical School Trustees Act, 1900, is hereby repealed, and the body corporate thereby constituted under the name of the Trustees of the Launceston Technical School is hereby dissolved.

3—(1) The property held by the Trustees of the Launceston Technical School is hereby vested in the Council of the Launceston Technical College constituted under the provisions of the Education Act, 1885.

(2) It shall be lawful for the Launceston Bank for Savings, without further authority than this Act, to transfer any moneys held by such Bank to the credit of the said Trustees to the credit of an account to be opened in the said Bank in the name of the said Council.

(3) It shall be lawful for the said Council, with the approval of the Minister, to apply the said property, and the income thereof, for any purpose for the benefit of the Launceston Technical College which may appear to the Council to be desirable.
