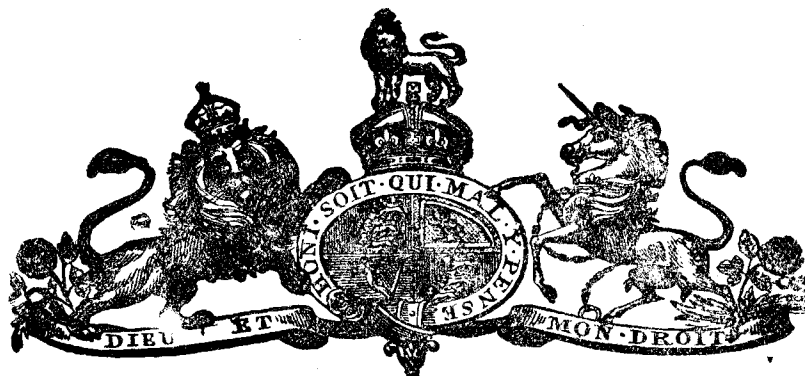

 AN ACT to amend the Longford Water Act,
 1898. [8 December, 1931.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as “The Longford Water Act, 1931.”
- 2 The Longford Water Act, 1898, is hereby amended—
 1. By inserting the figure “(1)” before the word “The” at the beginning of Section Sixty thereof and by adding at the end of that section the following new Subsection (2):—
 “(2) For the purposes of this Act the expression ‘domestic purposes’ shall mean the use of water on the

premises of any dwelling-house by the owner or occupier thereof and his family, servants, and workmen for the purposes of drinking, cooking, personal ablution, including baths; flushing urinals and water-closets; washing and cleansing such dwelling-house and all articles used therein for personal use or in connection with house-keeping; and for washing and cleansing any yard, out-house, stable, garage, or other outbuilding used in connection therewith, or any motor-car other than a motor-car used in connection with any trade or business, or which is washed or cleansed in the course of any trade or business.”:

II. By repealing Section Sixty-two thereof and substituting therefor the following new Section Sixty-two:—

“**62**—(1) The trustees, if they think fit, may furnish to any person a supply of water for any purpose other than domestic purposes.

(2) Any such supply may be furnished by meter or otherwise and at such charges and upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed or, where the same are not prescribed, as the trustees and the person to whom the supply is furnished may agree.

(3) As far as practicable, the supply of water, as provided by this section, shall be at uniform rates in all cases where the conditions are alike.”:

III. As to Section Sixty-three thereof—

(a) By inserting the figure “(1)” before the word “The” in the first line thereof:

(b) By deleting the words “stables, market gardens, and other” in the third line thereof: and

(c) By inserting at the end thereof the following new Subsections (2) and (3)—

“(2) Any such charge may be made and levied by the Council by resolution and upon public notification of such resolution any charge specified therein shall be payable as therein provided:

“(3) Where any such charge as aforesaid has been levied for any year in respect of a garden, not being a market garden or a garden to which water is supplied by meter, the owner or occupier of such garden may use water for such garden during such year within such hours as may be limited for that purpose as hereinafter provided without being liable for any further charge in respect thereof.”:

- V. By deleting the word "ten" in the fifth line of Section Seventy-eight thereof and substituting therefor the word "twenty" : Repeal of
Section 65.

- VI. By deleting the words "and sixty-three" in the fifth line of Section One hundred and thirty-two thereof and inserting the word "and" after the word "thirty-one" in the same line thereof : and
- VII. By inserting therein after Section One hundred and thirty-three the following new Section **133a** :— New Section
133a.
- " **133a**—(1) The trustees, at any time, by resolution, may limit the hours during which water may be used for gardening purposes, either generally or in respect of any specified part of the water district, and may fix different hours for different parts thereof, and either generally or for specified periods or parts of the year, but so that an equal number of hours shall be allowed for such purpose in every part of such district. Limitation

- (2) Every such resolution shall be published twice in a newspaper circulating in the Water District, and, upon the expiration of seven days after the second of such publications, the same shall have the effect of a by-law, and any person using water in contravention thereof shall be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds.
- (3) The Governor, by proclamation, at any time may revoke or vary any such resolution, and thereupon the same shall cease to have effect or shall have effect as so varied, as the case may be."
- 3**—(1) It shall be lawful for the trustees to raise by way of loan, in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bodies Loans Act, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Three thousand five hundred Pounds for the purposes of the Longford Water Act, 1898, in addition to any moneys previously borrowed. - (2) All moneys so raised shall be repayable at such date, and shall bear interest at such rate, as the Auditor-General shall direct by writing under his hand addressed to the trustees prior to the raising of such moneys.
