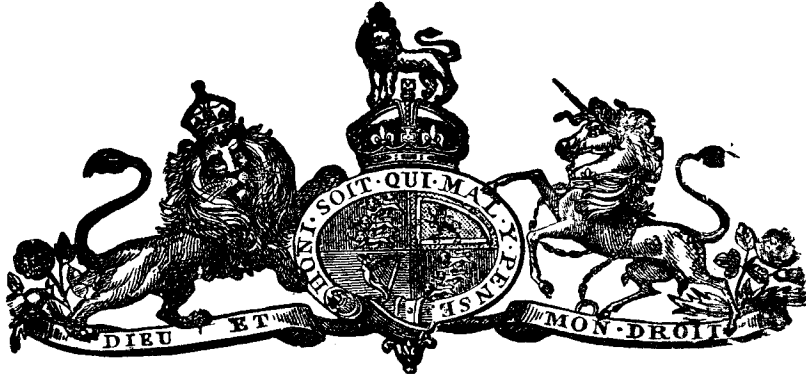

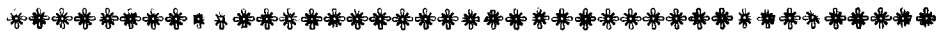

AN ACT to amend the Marriage Act, 1895. A.D. 1926.
—
 [17 September, 1926.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Marriage Act, 1926." Short title.
- 2 The Marriage Act, 1895, is hereby amended as follows:—
 - i. By deleting from the eighth line of Section Nineteen thereof the words "Two Shillings and Sixpence," and substituting therefor the words "Five Shillings : Amendment of 59 Vict. No. 23. Section 19
 - ii. By deleting from the twelfth line of Section Twenty thereof the words "One Shilling," and substituting therefor the words "Two Shillings and Sixpence : Section 20.

iii. By repealing Section Thirty-six thereof, and substituting therefor the following new Section Thirty-six :—

“**36**—(1) The Registrar-General shall cause indexes to be made and kept with the other records in his office.

(2) Any person shall be entitled, at any hour when such office is required to be open, and upon payment of the appropriate fee, to have a search made in such indexes on the register books, and to obtain a copy of any entry therein certified under the hand of the Registrar-General

(3) The fees payable in respect of searches and certificates respectively under this section shall be—

- i. Particular search of Index or Register Books only, including uncertified extract, Two Shillings :
- ii. General search of Index or Register Books, not exceeding one hour, including uncertified extract, Five Shillings ; for every additional hour, One Shilling and Sixpence :
- iii. Certificate without seal, with or without particular search, but not including general search, Five Shillings :
- iv. Certificate with seal, with or without particular search, but not including general search, Seven Shillings and Sixpence.

(4) No fee shall be payable in respect of any search or certificate required for any public purpose.”
