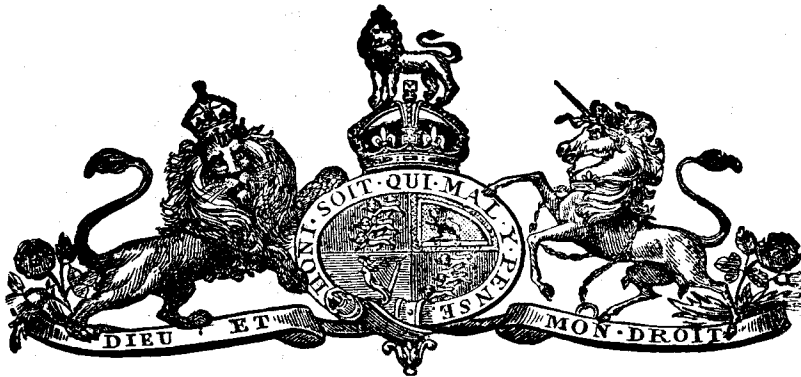

AN ACT to exempt Lessees and Licensees ^{A.D.} 1915.
on Active Service from Covenants under
Acts relating to Mines and Mining, and for
other purposes. [16 December, 1915.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Mining Covenants Exemption Act, 1915.” Short title.

2 This Act is incorporated with, and shall be read with, any Act for the time being in force, relating to mines and mining. Incorporation with other Acts.

Mining Covenants Exemption.

3 Exemption from the performance of all or any of the covenants of any mining lease or any licence (other than a prospector's licence), which has been, or hereafter may be granted or approved under any Act heretofore or for the time being in force relating to mining, may, in the discretion of the Governor, to such extent as he may think fit and on such conditions as he may impose, be granted by the Governor to the holder of such lease or licence upon application being made for the same, if such holder is engaged on active naval or military service with His Majesty's navy or army, or under the provisions of any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia during the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged.

Duration of
period of
exemption.

4 The period for which any such exemption may be granted shall commence on or after the Fourth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and shall end not later than the expiration of Six calendar months from the publication of a proclamation by the Governor-General in Council that a state of war no longer exists.

Act to extend to
applications made
before commence-
ment of Act.

5 The provisions of this Act shall also extend to any applications for such exemption as aforesaid received by the Department of Mines before the commencement of this Act.
